



## Fetal Health Surveillance Instructor Workshop 2011

<b>DESCRIPTION</b>	<p>This 2-day workshop. Participants must attend both days to receive instructor certification.</p> <p>Day 1 is the FHS Fundamentals program, during which students observe how the workshop is taught and note teaching strategies, which are discussed on day 2.</p> <p>Day 2 is comprised of instructor-specific training.</p> <p>Format includes both group work and didactic learning.</p>
<b>PREREQUISITES</b>	<p>This multidisciplinary workshop is designed for experienced practitioners who are expected to teach fetal health surveillance in their facility or region.</p> <p>Previous completion of a <u>Fundamentals of Fetal Health Surveillance Provider course</u> is required.</p>
<b>OBJECTIVES</b>	<p><b><u>DAY 1 (Fundamentals of Fetal Health Surveillance):</u></b></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1) Describe the SOGC recommendations for methods to monitor the fetus during labour.</li><li>2) Identify the definitions, characteristics, etiology, physiology/pathophysiology and classification of IA, EFM and NST findings.</li><li>3) Describe the appropriate clinical management for prevention and/or correction of abnormal IA, EFM, and NST findings.</li><li>4) Practice IA, EFM and NST interpretation.</li><li>5) Describe the appropriate clinical management for prevention and/or correction of atypical and abnormal FHR characteristics.</li><li>6) Consider the IA, EFM, and NST findings within the context of other assessment parameters for the purpose of decision-making based on a complete clinical picture.</li><li>7) Identify the relationship between teamwork and communication.</li><li>8) Describe appropriate documentation of IA and EFM parameters and findings.</li></ol> <p><b><u>DAY 2 (Instructor Workshop):</u></b></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1) Review SOGC 2007 FHSL Guidelines.</li><li>2) Discuss the flow, content, and feedback about the Fundamentals Day (Day 1).</li><li>3) Review principles of adult learning and self-efficacy.</li></ol>



	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>4) Discuss process of facilitating a successful FHSL program.</li> <li>5) Review specific FHSL content questions.</li> <li>6) Participate in a practice presentation to demonstrate the ability to facilitate a teaching session.</li> <li>7) Outline strategies for continuing education and updating of FHSL knowledge.</li> <li>8) Discuss strategies for guideline implementation (knowledge transfer).</li> </ul>
<b>TESTING</b>	Knowledge testing is incorporated throughout the course. Feedback and evaluations of practice sessions are provided by both instructors and participants.
